Composition	I can write simple sentences from memory after discussion with a teacher. I can sequence sentences to form short narratives. I can say out loud what I am going to write about. I can read aloud my writing. I understand how words can combine to make sentences.
Grammar	I can add the suffixes -s or -es to make a plural. I can use capital letters for names of people, the days of the week, places and the personal pronoun I. I can use the joining word 'and'.
